IN NEED OF PRAYER

(1 Timothy 2:1 – 8)

INTRODUCTION

(1 Samuel 12:23) “far be it from me that I should sin against the Lord in ceasing to pray for you”

1. WORLD LEADERS: (1 Timothy 2:1-2) “... for all men, for kings and all who are in authority,
that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence.”

2. THE ONE WHO REPENTS:

Because Israel was willing to put away the strange gods, (1 Samuel 7:5) “and Samuel said,
Gather all Israel to Mizpah, and I will pray to the Lord for you.”
(James 5:16) “Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another ... “

3. THE SICK: (3 John v1-2) “To the beloved Gaius, whom I love in truth: Beloved,
I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers.”

4. OUR CONGREGATIONAL UNITY: (John 17:1) “Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes
to heaven, and said, Father ... (v20-21) I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who
will believe in Me through their word: that they all may be one ... “

Paul exhorted: (Eph. 4:3) “endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace”
(Psalm 133:1-2) “Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together
in unity. It is like precious oil upon the head ... “

5. ALL OF US: (Philippians 1:3-4) “I thank my God upon every remembrance of you,
always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy ... “

(Colossians 1:3) “We give thanks to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
praying always for you”

6. THE PREACHER: (Ephesians 6:18-19) “praying always with all prayer ... and for me,
that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known
the mystery of the gospel”

7. THOSE EXPERIENCING ANXIETY AND DISASTER: (Philippians 4:6-7)
“Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving,
let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all
understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.”

8. THOSE IN NEED OF SALVATION: (1 Timothy 2:1) “... supplications, prayers,
intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men” (v3-4) “For this is good and
acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and
to come to the knowledge of the truth.”
