- 1) Because of the order of the universe, nature (acts of God).

WHAT IS THE "SILVER LINING" IN MY STRUGGLES?

- 1. (Heb. 12:4-11) (v11) "... afterward it yields the peaceable fruit"
 - (v5) "despise not ... nor faint" (v7) "if ye endure chastening" (v10) "for our profit"
 - "Afterward" being in the storm is not pleasant; however, later we reap the fruit.

 We suffer the rigor of education to get the degree; daily work for a weekend paycheck; we salve a sore for it to eventually heal.

2. Struggles cause me not to be satisfied with this life.

Heaven is not on this earth. So, we sing: This World Is Not My Home; Camping Toward Canaan's Land; To Canaan's Land I'm On My Way

3. Struggles cause me to be sympathetic toward another's struggles.

I say to them, "I know something about what you are going through" "May I help?"

4. Struggles cause me to have confidence to overcome in a different struggle of mine.

Because I got through a previous trial, I can get through this one, too.

5. My struggles give confidence to others that they may overcome theirs, too.

Others may say, "If Brian can get through it, so can I" and "Maybe he can help me."

6. Struggles give me patience.

Having overcome lesser struggles, I can get through the tougher ones. (Romans 5:3) "tribulation works patience" (James 1:2) "your faith works patience"

7. Struggles provide a check on my evil tendencies.

Knowing an attitude or action of mine hurt me or another, I'm not doing it again.

8. Struggles cause me to appreciate the good times.

Work hard and appreciate the rest; been ill and appreciate health; been lonely and appreciate friends; etc.

9. Struggles verify God's teaching.

(Psalm 119:71) "It is good for me that I have been afflicted; that I might learn thy statutes"

God, as a Father, permits me to suffer some things because it's for my profit. So I learned "preventive medicine," too.
