(Acts 3:11-21)

### INTRODUCTION

"Conversion" - to turn from one course of thinking or action to another.

(Romans 12:2) "Be not conformed to this world, but be ye transformed ..."

Word used in other places: (Matt. 18:3) "unless you are converted" (Matt. 13:15-16) "and turn" (Acts 15:3) "the conversion of the Gentiles"

Three distinct changes which determine our "conversion" to Christ; to become a Christian:

## 1. CHANGE OF HEART (produced by faith)

(Romans 10:13-14) "... and how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard?" (v17) "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."

Preaching the word of God produces faith in God and in His message of salvation.

(Mark 16:15-16) "... preach the gospel ... he who believes will be saved ... "
(John 20:30-31) "... but these are written, that you might believe... and that believing... "

#### 2. CHANGE OF LIFE (produced by repentance)

(Acts 3:19) "Repent therefore and be converted ... "

(Luke 13:3, v5) "but unless you repent you will all likewise perish" (Acts 17:30-31) "God ... now commands all men everywhere to repent ... "Repent" - involves both a turning from sin and a turning to God by faith. (2 Cor. 7:10) "for godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation"

(1 Thess. 1:7) "you became examples to all" (v8) "your faith toward God" (v9) "you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God"

#### 3. CHANGE OF RELATIONSHIP (produced by baptism)

The sequence in conversion noted in (Acts 2:36-38) "... now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart ... repent, and be baptized ... "

(v40-41) "those who gladly received his word were baptized ... added to them ... "

(v47) "the Lord added to the church ... " - that's a change in relationship.

(Gal. 3:26-28) "sons of God ... were baptized ... all one in Christ Jesus"

# CLOSE - "and be converted" may be illustrated by a couple "getting married."

- 1) Change of heart believes you're the one, and "Will you marry me?"
- 2) Change of life a visible change, have eyes for one another only.
- 3) Change of relationship ceremony, and "I pronounce you husband and wife."
