"I WILL BRING YOU OUT"

(Exodus 6:2-9)

INTRODUCTION

In this Old Testament story, God is sending Moses to deliver the Israelites out of the bondage they have in Egypt and to march them to the promised land.

"Bondage" - to enslave; to hold captive; to be held in service to another.

In the New Testament story, God sends His Son to deliver us from the bondage of sin and puts us on a march to the heavenly promised land.

(Matthew 1:21; Romans 6:6 and v16-18) This O.T. story has a N.T. lesson for us: comparative lessons.

1. REMEMBER WHO GOD IS

(Exodus 6:2) "God spoke to Moses and said to him, I am the Lord"
Our deliverance begins with God: (Psalm 111:10; Matthew 10:28; Psalm 4:4)

2. REMEMBER WHAT GOD HAS DONE

(Ex. 6:3) "I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty ... " Our deliverance has power because of God's past performance: (Romans 5:8-11)

3. REMEMBER THAT GOD CARES

(Ex. 6:5) "And I have also heard the groaning of the children of Israel whom the Egyptians keep in bondage" (1 Peter 5:7; John 3:16; 2 Peter 1:3)

4. REMEMBER THE PROMISES OF GOD

(Ex. 6:5-6) "... and I have remembered My covenant. Therefore say to the children of Israel, I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians ... "
We must believe the promises of God: (Titus 1:2; Heb. 10:17; Romans 8:1-2)

5. REMEMBER THAT GOD SAVES US

(Ex. 6:6) "... and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great judgments"(Eph. 2:8-10) it's not our genius, goodness, nor talents that deliver us from bondage of sin. God voluntarily provided us what we needed and could not provide for ourselves.

6. REMEMBER THAT WE MUST "HEAR AND DO" GOD'S WILL

(Ex. 6:9) "... but they did not heed Moses ..."
Listen and do - (Matthew 7:21-29; John 14:15; James 1:22)
