INTRODUCTION - Now, all together, let's complete (complement) our salvation.

1. PAUL

- (v17) "if I am being poured out as a drink offering" Philippians, your faith is the main offering, and my life is just the drink-offering that is poured out at the end. (Ex. 29:38-40)
- "I am glad and rejoice with you all / be glad and rejoice with me"
 I appreciate your sacrificial faith, appreciate mine.
- (v19) and (v24) "But I trust in the Lord" (Proverbs 16:9; James 4:13-16)

2. (v19-24) TIMOTHY

- (v20) "I have no one like-minded" Timothy will match Paul's care for them.
 - "who will sincerely care for your state" heartfelt; unfeigned; honest; good faith. "but you know his proven character" Timothy would certainly be welcomed.
- (v22) "as a son with his father he served with me in the gospel" "with"

3. (v25 – 28) EPAPHRODITUS - "necessary to send to you Epaphroditus"

"my brother" - emphasizes the relationship we enjoy in the family of God.

Term used in the letter: (1:12, v14; 2:25; 3:1, v13, v17; 4:1, v8, v21)

"fellow worker" - (1 Corinthians 3:9) "For we are God's fellow workers"

"and fellow soldier" - reference to Christian's warfare.

Noted elsewhere: (Ephesians 6:10-18; 1 Timothy 6:12; 2 Tim. 2:3 and 4:7)

"but your messenger" - sent from the church in Philippi to see Paul: (4:18)

- "who ministered to my need" second-mile Christianity, did more than expected.
 - (v26) "he was longing to see you all" he was home-sick and deathly sick.
 - (v30) "he came close to death, not regarding his life, ... in your service to me"

4. (v27) GOD

- "but God had mercy on him" God had a hand in his recovery.
- "but on me also" without the recovery, Paul would have "sorrow upon sorrow."

5. (v28 – 29) BRETHREN IN PHILIPPI - "and when you see him"

- "rejoice" always good to get together, but especially after a long absence, back home from mission trip, and knowing that he has recently been rescued from danger.
- "receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness" remember God's work in this.
- "hold such men in esteem" appreciate; regard highly; cherish; think well of.
