"HUNGER AND THIRST FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS"

(Matthew 5:6)

INTRODUCTION - Jesus takes a physical sensation and develops a spiritual lesson.

(Matthew 4:4) "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." (John 6:27) "Do not labor for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to everlasting life, which the Son of Man will give you ..."

1. "HUNGER AND THIRST" - and it's repetitious.

"Hunger" - to be famished; starved; distressed because of lack of food.

"Thirst" - painfully feel the want of; parched; to pant; to eagerly long for.

Jesus' words had understandable significance to an Israelite audience.

The Israelite travel experience was quite different from our experience.

Examples: of what people do to satisfy "hunger and thirst:"

(Genesis 25:34) Esau sold his birthright to Jacob "for bread and stew." (Numbers 11:5-6) Israelites said, "Our soul is dried away" and murmured. (2 Kings 6:24-29) A famine in Samaria, "So we boiled my son, and ate him"

This beatitude 1) gives a demand for Christian living 2) gives a cause for failure in Christian living 3) and it's not "blessed are those who have attained righteousness;" rather, those who "hunger and thirst for righteousness."

2. "AFTER RIGHTEOUSNESS"

"**Righteousness**" - that which is right toward God; adhere to God's word; "proving what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

(Psalm 119:172) "My tongue shall speak of Thy word: for all Thy commandments are righteousness." (Psalm 42:1-2; 63:1-8)

3. "FOR THEY SHALL BE FILLED" - filled with what? "righteousness!"

"Filled" - satisfied; all I need; lacking nothing.

Lesson: Physically, we get "full / filled;" however, we get hungry and thirsty again. The desire for food returns or keeps coming back again.

Spiritually, the same; so, keep "hungering and thirsting for righteousness."

CLOSE: Don't ever lose the desire for God's word!
