(Matthew 5:5)

INTRODUCTION - Today's world says, "The meek get run over."

1. WHAT THE BEATITUDE "MEEKNESS" IS NOT

Jesus is not speaking of mousey or "meek as a mouse;" not the comic-strip character Mr. Casper Milquetoast; not the spineless character who is afraid of his own shadow; not the one who is void of manly vigor and courage.

2. WHAT IS "MEEK" IN CHARACTER

Greek dictionary: not easily provoked or irritated; patient under injuries; not vain.

O.T. or Hebrew ancestry of the word: one who accepts the providence of God; does not grow resentful and bitter about things life brings to him; believes God will bring about eternal good.

(Psalm 25:9, 37:9, 37:11, 147:6, 149:4)

Greek illustrations: an animal which has been tamed, domesticated, and which is subject to control. Aristotle described it as the mean between two extremes: happy medium between excessive anger and excessive non-anger. The virtue of one who acts with gentleness when he has the power to act with stern severity.

3. EXAMPLES

Moses: (Numbers 12:3) "Moses was very humble ("meek")."
(Exodus 5:1) stands before Pharaoh saying, "Let my people go."
(Exodus 14:13) at the Red Sea saying, "Fear not"

Jesus: (Matthew 11:28-30) "For I am gentle ("meek") and lowly in heart" (Mark 3:5-6; Mark 11:15-17; Matthew 23:13-29; 1 Peter 2:23)

Us: (Titus 3:1-2) " ... showing all humility ("meekness") to all men."

4. THE BLESSING OF "THEY SHALL INHERIT THE EARTH"

It is not physical land owner-ship; rather, we know how to enjoy our earthly portion here (whether great or small); we know how to live peaceably in this land, contented, with hope of heaven. We sing: Here We Are But Straying Pilgrims and This World Is Not My Home

(James 1:21) "receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls."
