PASSOVER WEEKEND

1. UPPER ROOM EVENTS

(Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-38; John 13 – 17)

- 1) Jesus washes the feet of the disciples: (John 13:1-5)
- 2) Jesus identifies His betrayer: (John 13:18-30)
- 3) Jesus predicts Peter's denial: (John 13:36-38)
- 4) Jesus announces His going away: (John 14:1-3)
- 5) Jesus promises another Helper: (John 14:16)
- 6) Jesus instructs on the work of "the Helper, the Holy Spirit:"
(John 14:25-226; 15:26; 16:6-8 and v13-14)
- 7) Jesus prays: (John 17:1 – 26)
- 8) Jesus, with His disciples, observes the Passover: (Mark 14:12-17)
- 9) Jesus, with His disciples, institutes His own supper:
(Mark 14:22-25; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26)
- 10) (Mark 14:26) "And when they had sung a hymn,
they went out to the Mount of Olives"

2. EVENTS IN GETHSEMANE

(Matthew 26:36-56; Mark 14:32-50; Luke 22:39-53; John 18:1-12)

1) (Matthew 26:36-56)

- (v39) Jesus prays, "not as I will, but as You will"
- (v40, v41, v45) three times Jesus finds the disciples sleeping.
- (v47-49) Judas and the betrayal kiss.
- (v51) the servant of the high priest had his ear cut off.
- (v53) the Father could have provided "more than 12 legions of angels"
- (v56) "All this was done that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled.
Then all the disciple forsook Him and fled."

2) (John 18:1-13)

- (v5, v6, v8) three times Jesus says, "I am He."
- (v12) "the detachment ... the captain ... the officers of the Jews
arrest Jesus and bound Him."

3. THE 6 TRIALS OF JESUS

- 1) (John 18:12-13) "... they led Him away to **Annas first** ... "
- 2) (John 18:24) "Then Annas **sent Him bound to Caiaphas** the high priest"
- 3) (John 18:28) "Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas **to the Praetorium** ... "
 (Matthew 26:57-69) "the chief priests, the elders, and all the council ... "
 (Luke 22:66-71) "the elders ... chief priests and scribes ... their council ... "
- 4) (Luke 23:1) "the multitude of them (council) arose **and led Him to Pilate.**"
 (Matthew 27:1-2) "... when they had bound Him, they led Him away and delivered Him to Pontius Pilate the governor."
 (v2 - 10) remorseful Judas returns the 30 pieces of silver, and he went and hanged himself. He was buried in the potter's field.
 (v11) "Now Jesus stood before the governor."
- 5) (Luke 23:6 - 8) "... **he sent Him to Herod**, who was in Jerusalem at that time"
- 6) (Luke 23:11) "Then Herod ... **sent Him back to Pilate.**"
 (Luke 23:24-25) "So Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they requested ... **he delivered Jesus to their will.**"
 (Matthew 27:27 - 31) "Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole garrison around Him ... **and led Him away to be crucified.**"

4. PILATE TRIED 4 WAYS TO RELEASE JESUS

- 1) (Luke 23:6-7) Said Jesus belonged to Herod's jurisdiction and sent Him.
- 2) (Luke 23:13-15) After examination of Jesus, he told the people, "I have found no fault in this Man ... neither did Herod"
- 3) (Luke 23:16) "I will therefore chastise Him and release Him."
- 4) (Luke 23:17) "for it was necessary for him to release one to them at the feast"
 (v20) "Pilate, therefore, wishing to release Jesus, again called out to them, But they shouted, saying, Crucify, crucify Him."

5. JESUS' 7 WORDS FROM THE CROSS

- 1) (Luke 23:34) "then Jesus said, Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."
- 2) (Luke 23:43) "And Jesus said to him, Assuredly, I say to you, Today you will be with Me in Paradise."

- 3) (John 19:26-27) "When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing by, He said to His mother, Woman, behold your son. Then He said to the disciple, Behold your mother. And from that hour that disciple took her to his own."
- 4) (Matthew 27:46) "And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is, My God, My God, Why have You forsaken Me?"
- 5) (John 19:28) "I thirst."
- 6) (John 19:30) "It is finished"
- 7) (Luke 23:46) "And when Jesus had cried out with a loud voice, He said, Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit. Having said that, **He breathed His last.**"

6. JESUS' BODY IS BURIED: (Mark 15:42 – 47)

7. JESUS' BODY IS RESURRECTED

(Luke 24:1 – 12)

(1 Corinthians 15:1-4)

(v12 – 19) "... but if there is no resurrection of the dead,
then Christ is not risen,
 And if Christ is not risen, then **our preaching is empty** and
your faith is also empty.
 Yes, and **we are found false witnesses of God,**
 because we have testified of God that He raised up Christ ...
 For if the dead do not rise, then Christ is not risen.
 And if Christ is not risen, your **faith is futile**, you are **still in your sins.**
 Then **also those who have fallen asleep** in Christ have perished.
 If in this life only we have hope in Christ,
 we are of all men the **most pitiable.**"
