1. (v9) "... that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone"

"who was made ("for a little while") a little lower than the angels"

This event given more explanation in (Hebrews 1:1-14 and 2:1-4)

"for the suffering of death" - angels not subject to earthly life-span and death.

"that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone" (1 Timothy 2:5-6; Revelation 5:9)

2. (v10) "... to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings"

"For it was fitting for Him" ("became Him") - met the qualifications.

"Captain" - Jesus once stood where we now stand; led the way; been there and done that.

"through sufferings" - yes, Jesus experienced all of it and overcame it.

3. (v14) "Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself shared the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death ... the devil"

"shared the same" - (Philippians 2:7-8; John 1:1-2 and v14)

"destroy him" - (12 Timothy 1:9-10; 1 John 3:8; 1 Corinthians 15:24-26)
Hymn #344 v3 "Death cannot keep its prey ... "

- (v15) "and release those who through fear of death ... lifetime subject to bondage" (Psalm 23:4; John 11:25)
- 5. (v16) "For indeed He does not give aid to angels, but He does give aid to the seed of Abraham" (Galatians 3:6-9 and v29)
- 6. (v17) "Therefore, in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God ..."
- 7. (v17) "... to make propitiation for the sins of the people."

"propitiation" - expiation; reconciliation; atone; peace-offering.
(Romans 3:24-25; 1 John 2:2 and 4:9-10; 2 Cor. 5:18; Heb. 9:11-12 and 10:4)

8. (v18) "For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted,He is able to aid those who are tempted." - again, Jesus once stood where we now stand.

Hymn #396 No, Not One and #506 No One Ever Cared For Me Like Jesus (Hebrews 4:14-15) "... High Priest ... tempted as we are, yet without sin."
