INTRODUCTION Beginning in chapter 3, apostle Paul draws out the application of the theological truths of chapters 1 and 2. In teaching and preaching, we recognize the need for balance of doctrine and behavior.

THREE THINGS ABOUT BEING "WITH CHRIST" 1. (v1-4)

1) "You were raised with Christ" a look back!

> (NEB) "were you not raised to life with Christ" This references our baptism: (Colossians 2:12-13; Romans 6:4)

2) "You died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God" - a look at the present!

(Romans 6:6-8) "... for he who has died has been freed from sin"

"Seek those things which are above" - pursue with the purpose of finding things of higher importance, exalted principles, the spiritual rather than carnal. "Set your mind on things above" - think about it, put thought into it, let it sink in. "Your life is hidden with Christ" - words to hymn #508 A Wonderful Savior

3) "When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory" - a look to the future!

> (John 14:3) "... I will come again and receive you to Myself ... " (Philippians 3:20-21) "For our citizenship is in heaven ... we wait for the Savior ... "

2. (v5-9) (v5) "PUT TO DEATH" (v8) "PUT OFF"

- (v6) "Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience"
 - (v5) "Fornication" all kinds of immorality
 "Uncleanness" connected to loose living

 - "Passion" state of mind that finds excitement in wrong doing.
 - "Evil desire" an appetite for wrong that tries to find satisfaction in it.
 - "Covetousness, which is idolatry" an inner jealousy displayed outwardly (v8) "Anger, wrath, and malice" sudden outbursts that are destructive
 - - "Blasphemy" when directed toward God, it means to defame Him, to hold contempt for Him, to rail against or speak evil of Him
 - "Filthy language" obscenity, profanity, curse
 - (v9) "Do not lie" to be untruthful directly or indirectly
- (v9) "Since you have put off the old man with his deeds" we have new purpose in Christ.

3. (v10 - 11) "AND HAVE PUT ON THE NEW MAN ... "

(Romans 6:4) "... even so we also should walk in newness of life."

(2 Corinthians 5:17) "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away, behold, all things have become new."
