"BROTHERLY LOVE"

(Romans 12:9-16)

- INTRODUCTION: (Romans 12:10) "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another."
- In (1 Corinthians 12), apostle Paul used the physical body to illustrate that we are to function as "many members in one body." Note: v14, v20, v21, v25

In (Romans 12:10), Paul uses "brotherly love" to illustrate our life together; family relationship.

THE TEXT GIVES US A WORD-STUDY

1. "BROTHERLY" - a family term literally meaning "from the same womb."

When we were physically born, we were born into a family.

When we became Christians, we were "born again," this time into God's family.

(Galatians 4:4-5) "receive the adoption as sons" (Gal. 3:26-27) "sons of God" Hymn #744 God's Family

2. "BROTHERLY LOVE" - describes a family love that is good, excellent, and caring.

(1 Thessalonians 4:9-10) "concerning brotherly love"
(Hebrews 13:1) "Let brotherly love continue" (1 Peter 3:8) "love as brothers"

3. "KINDLY" - doing things that benefit another.

It means to have a gentle considerate nature; be good-hearted; helpful; gracious.

(Ephesians 4:32) "And be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you."

- 4. "AFFECTIONATE" "devoted to;" desire to help; notice a parent's behavior to their child.
- 5. "IN HONOR" to value another; to hold in high regard; give respect; accolade.

(1 Corinthians 12:26) "if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it"

(Romans 13:7) "honor to whom honor" (Matthew 7:12) the "Golden Rule"

6. "PREFERRING ONE ANOTHER" - let the other go first; share; show no favoritism.

Example: "What is the most difficult instrument to play in the orchestra?"

(Philippians 2:3-4) "no selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other ... nor for his own interests, but for the interests of others."
